## Mentoring 4 Reading Achievement

### What is M4RA?

- 1:1 reading mentoring for students reading below grade level
- 30 minute sessions 4 times per week—before, during, or after school

### Who is eligible?

- All Public or Private Schools

### What will schools receive?

#### At no cost:

- 1 full day of Reading Mentoring Instruction for key staff
- 1/2 day of Reading Mentoring Instruction
- 2 Resource Guide Books per school
- Ongoing Consultation for support

### Why 1:1 reading mentoring?

- Research demonstrates that students can make month for month reading level gains when mentored 3-4 times per week
- Increased self confidence which paves the way for reading success
